## New Diagnostic Imaging Center Buildings Delayed Last Week and Will Begin Arriving This Week

Here is the latest news on the planned arrival of the DI Center modular buildings in Fort Bragg. They were delayed from being moved last week due to the requirements of the CHP and Caltrans. Our General Contractor, JLC is going to have to trim trees along the route - both on 101 and 20 as they move the modules up the highway. Caltrans will also have to raise some wires in order for the modules to pass. On Monday, August 30 they are planned to be transported to Willits for staging and they should be able to start moving them over Hwy 20 on Tuesday, August 31. JLC has permission to transport 2 modules per day. With 21 modules in all, it will take at least 11 working days to get all of the modules to Fort Bragg.

## Financial Results for Month of July Revealed at August Board Meeting

Finance Committee Chair, Sean Hogan reported on the results of the financial reports for MCDH for both the months of June and July of 2010 at the August Board Meeting. The unaudited June year end results revealed a small net profit of \$63,000 for the fiscal year ended on June 30, 2010. "This is due to \$2,359,830 in non-operating revenues (property taxes, investment income and donations) that offset a loss from operations of \$2,296,571" said Finance Chair Hogan. For the month of July, MCDH experienced very high gross patient revenues of \$8,251,925 and operating expenses below budget. The result was a "break even" month with a small net loss of \$7,249, which was \$60,000 better than budget. Hogan pointed out that the July financials could have been much better except that bad debt write-offs for the month were \$236,000 over budget. Without the high bad debt write-offs, it would have been an extremely good month. According to Hogan, this was a good start to the new fiscal year.
